OUTDOOR BOX BIRD FEEDER FUN

Outdoor activities are at the heart of Scouting. This activity is for Beavers but any section or leaders could take part too !

What you need:

- Toilet Roll (inner)
- String
- Bird Seed
- Peanut Butter
- Scissors
- Butter Knife and Plate

How to make it:

The summer is almost over and soon the garden birds will need to find food as food supplies are harder to find.

- This simple to make bird feeder is low cost and a great way to give the birds a helping hand.
- 1. Take the inner of a toilet roll and remove any tissue that may be still attached this is very important so that the birds do not eat the tissue paper.
- 2. Pour some bird seed onto a plate.
- 3. Using the butter knife, thinly spread the tube with some peanut butter.
- 4. Gently roll the toilet roll inner over the plate so that the seeds stick to it.
- 5. Set aside to dry for an hour or so.
- 6. Cut a 30cm length of string to thread through the toilet roll inner, tie a knot to make a loop and hang the feeder from a tree branch high enough so visiting birds are safe from cats or dogs.

Greater things for the great outdoors:

Why not look on the internet to try to identify the birds that visit your garden. You could keep a record of the number of each type of bird that visit your garden – which is the most popular bird?

Safety Notes:

Online Access: Supervise young people when they're online and give them advice about staying safe.

Scissors / Sharp Objects: Supervise young people appropriately when they're using scissors. Store all sharp objects securely, out of the reach of young people.

Food / Allergies: Check for allergies before you begin. Make sure you have suitable areas for storing and preparing food and avoid cross contamination of different foods. All activities must be safely managed.
